KSA, has over the years, managed projects commissioned by prestigious organization like SarDorabji Tata Trust (SDTT), Ratanji Tata Trust (RDTT), Trust microfin network (TMS), Trust Community Livelihood (TCL), Department of International development fund (DFID), Ministry of Women & Child Development, India (WCD, India), Childline India Foundation (CIF), Women Development Corporation (WDC, Bihar), Rashtriya Gramin Vikas Nidhi (RGVN), Swyam Sikshan Prayog {SSP}, National Minorities Development and Finance Corporation (NMDF), Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS), State Bank of India (SBI), Health Institute for Mother and Child (HIMC) National Bank of Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD), HDFC, ICICI, MAMTA, US-Aid, National Horticulture Board under the ministry of Agriculture, Support programme for urban reforms (department of urban development and housing department govt. of Bihar, State health society Bihar, District health society Muzaffarpur and Darbhanga, Trust community livelihood (TCL), Water for people Denver America and others govt& non Govt. The organization from the last 10 years, has taken the issue of capacity building of ASHAs & AWWs (Six days, seven days, 15 days & one month residential training), Development urban slum infrastructure through women, empowerment of women and provide legal and moral support, Promotion of rural women entrepreneur as SAKHI through clean & green energy business, child care & protection, HIV/AIDS & tuberculosis, Community health, Individual health, Rain water harvesting, social and behaviour change, Community institutional building in rural & urban areas like SHGs, JLGs Federation & co-operative, Samuhik Vikash Samitee, Neighborhood groups, Disaster task force, farmers clubs for sustainable agriculture livelihood and innovative agriculture practices and Kishori samuh.

CURRENT PROJECTS

CHILDLINE COLLAB - DARBHANGA

Children should have a beautiful future so that they can become a participant in the development of their family, society and country, whereas if help is not provided to the needy and immediate children, then they can harm the society with negative energy. So children are the invaluable asset of our society, so that it can be taken care of properly, for this purpose, our organization is operating a collab organisation at Darbhanga district in collaboration with CHILDLINE India Foundation since last 15 years (2006) Under this, we are not only providing proper and necessary assistance to the needy with the help of link service, but also making every section of the society aware about why it is necessary to protect children, why child labor, child marriage, child buying and selling is wrong, also working to awareness. We tell people about the laws related to children, its protector officers, the role of voluntary organizations and the schemes of the government related to children.

The following things are told in the awareness meeting -

- What is the Child protection policy of government
- What is the role of 1098 toll free child helpline number, how it functioned ?
- What is the child welfare committee, how it functioned
- What is the Juvenile justice board, how it functioned.
- Child protection Why
- What action to be taken against child trafficker?
- What is the Childline program and how it functioned?
- What is the child right, and how we are (All people) its custodian
- We do this type of meeting with the following people / organizations of the society –
- Student, Teacher, PRIs Member, Block Officials, Bankers, Police Department, ICDS, Asha & Anganwardi, Factory, Shop Keeper, Bus Stand, Railway Station etc.

Last year Covid and lockdown has presented a lot of challenge in front of us. We have continued our efforts even in this difficult situation, as they needed our help. In the meantime.



CHILD HELP DESK (CHD) - CHHAPARA RAILWAY STATION

For the past many years, our workers, supported in Darbhanga, have given very good results in the direction of child protection on the strength of hard work, the result of their tireless hard work is that the Ministry of Women and Child Development and Childline India Foundation has given us the established CHILD HELP DESK at railway station, Chhapra. Last three years the privilege of working on important topics like child protection, child care and prevention of child buying and selling. In the first year itself, we have succeeded in reaching out to the good result and established good relation with sources and officers. Covid and lockdown have posed a lot of challenge in front of us. We have continued our efforts even in this difficult situation, as it was important to reach out to the key people at the earliest that they have provided the necessary help to the children, the main support being shelter, rehabilitation, medical help, protection from abuse, emotional support and 1098 toll free services have been started for guidance, and our team has started reaching out to the needy children and providing them the necessary help. We have not got a chance to succeed even more due to less traffic at the station due to the lockdown. We are doing this type of meeting with station master, superident, GRPs, RPFs, CWC, NGOs, Police department, vendors and baggers etc. To make them aware of following things are trying to.

- Why Child Protection? What is the child protection policy of the government?
- What is the role of 1098 Toll free Child Help Line Number, how does it work?
- What is Child Welfare Committee, how does it work?
- What is Juvenile Justice Board, how does it work?
- What action should be taken against child traffickers?
- What is Child Line Program and how does it work?
- What is child right, and how are we (all people) its guardians.



PROJECT SHEOHAR – ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT APPROCH THROUGH WATER AND SENITATION

Our reached out to the small and marginal farmers, forming 162 farmers' clubs enclosing 4824 families. These farmers have been trained around different agriculture-based interventions. KSA has provided irrigation facilities to 553 farmers through 50 bore wells, one unit of lift irrigation, and benefitted 254 farmers through nine units of rain guns and six sprinklers which are helping in saving water.

To increase the yield of cereal crops, KSA introduced line sowing and systematic rice intensification techniques to around 480 farmers, using high yielding varieties like Rajendra Bhagwati and Arize 6444. To further increase the yield KSA introduced plugging back of green manure like Sesbaniabispinosa and lentil seedlings for nitrogen fixation. To promote vegetable production, KSA introduced high yielding variety seeds for different vegetables like Okra, Chili, Cauliflower and Cabbage. The multilayer crop method was also used to maximize the use of land. We also promoted approximately 115 units of coordinated compost pits for promoting the use of organic fertilizers. In enterprise development, KSA supported 25 vermin compost units, 5 green house nurseries and 85 units of organic pesticides.

KSA achieved the targets within time, reaching out to 750 farmers in the areas of irrigation facilities, crop management, and enterprise development. KSA was able to reach the small and marginal farmers, trying to improve their economic well-being of the farmers. 750 farmers were provided access to irrigation facilities through bore wells and water saving technology such as rain gun and sprinklers. KSA was able to build the capacity of farmers around crop management through the introduction of the best practices in paddy and vegetable crops. KSA promoted agriculture-based enterprises around vermin compost, greenhouse nursery, and organic pesticides. Farmers responded well to organic pesticides, and they were able to earn out of it. To promote solid waste and sanitation in the villages KSA introduced the use of coordinated compost pit, which resulted in high quality compost.

Through this successful project, we have succeeded in increasing the income of farmers by two to three times with the cooperation of various stakeholders. We also success to arrange funds 3 time of project fund through stakeholders.



MISSION PANI - NALANDA

The KSA, with the support of the WFP, launched a pilot intervention in Nalanda district of Bihar. Induction and orientation of the project team completed. A systematic approach, mobilization and entry point activities were carried out to identify the intervention village. Basic and relevant village plan/micro plan prepared. The promotion of Kisan Club was started and a total of 15 such clubs are now functioning. The social arts component was aligned to form Watson Committees in all intervention villages.

The project is proceeding with its main objective that how to reduce water consumption in the fields and there should be no impact on production, but production can be increased in advance by promoting advanced and scientific based farming. Rain water harvesting and its use for drinking is the main purpose of agriculture, as well as agricultural machines like rain guns, sprinklers and drip kits are being used for water harvesting. Regarding technology transfer, improvement in agriculture, specific intervention points were identified such as: line sowing and crop intensification. Crop specific varieties of cereals (R Bhagwati, Arize 6444 and HD 2967) were introduced. Adoption up-scaling was availed through government convergence and various schemes. Green mining (via *Sesbaniabispinosa*) intervention also improved crop yield and quality. Improved and disease/pest tolerant variety of vegetables (okra, chilli, cauliflower and cabbage), coupled with multilayer farming model led to increased land productivity. To sensitize the community on solid waste management, promotion of coordinating compost pits (conversion of biomass and agricultural waste into manure) was well taken up by the community. Rain Water and water economizing technology is a issue of social and behavior change, so we are done large number of multidisciplinary shows through stage show and street show related to water issues..It's a very impactful and result oriented initiatives .



Swayam Shikshan Prayog Supported Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adoption Programme

KSA has successfully run the program "Strengthening and Scaling Up Capacities and Initiatives in Climate Change Adoption and Disaster Risk Reduction Hanuman Nagar and Sadar Block of Darbhanga District with the support of Swayam Shikshan Prayog, Pune, Maharashtra. With the support of this project, we have been successful in producing a large number of community based women leaders, this project is the contribution of our workers to the organization. Be it at the time of floods, Covid lockdown, Covid awareness, lack of face masks, during Covid times of unemployment in the family, they have shown efficient leaders by leading their society in every difficult time.

We have decided to make the experience gained from this journey charioteer with new agricultural research, organic farming, new and old experiments since 2009 till now and try to help people with disaster based schemes and agriculture schemes of the government. Sustainability, refinement and capacity building of community leaders have been a priority for all successful efforts.

Keeping these objectives in mind, we have started work. To achieve all objectives, we have strategized to achieve success by combining prior experience, innovation and experience from network organizations. These are our three main objectives -

- The ability of poor communities to cope with negative climate change sequences has increased to the extent that climate change is addressed and disaster risk reduction (DRR) measures are discussed.
- Women handling coordination responsibilities including diversification of agriculture to avoid contamination of drinking water, introduction of new disaster preparedness measures such as introduction of intensive rice cultivation or construction of raised hand-pumps. Disaster Mitigation Network is recognizable and active at the district level in Bhagalpur.

Community Resilience fund - Under the CRF, small amounts are given to the women leaders in the community, which they give to the women leader groups and the women associated with the disaster relief teams according to their need. The ownership of this money belongs to the community itself and the community takes help from it while increasing this fund. The special thing is that this experiment is proving to be a small-small initiative to liberate us from the dangerous consequences of climate change and livelihood is also increasing. Though this amount is very small, it has played a very important role in improving the condition of rural women of Bihar for a long time.



BIHAR SUSTENEBLE DEVELOPMENT LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME, MUZAFFARPUR.

For the Bihar Sustainable Livelihood Development (BSLD) project, KSA selected Bandra block in Muzaffarpur district of Bihar. The project is spread over 35 revenue villages under 10 panchayats. Considering its backwardness, low economic opportunity for the poorest of the poor and clear gender inequality especially for marginalized communities, the project works with 70% level farmers and 30% B level farmers. We have started work with the goal of increasing the income of these families to the average income through improved and organic farming along with animal husbandry especially goat rearing and poultry farming. Training and capacity building will be a big weapon in this effort. Significant cooperation of government schemes and banking is expected. This project has just been started and a strong foundation is being laid for the long journey.



COVID RESPONSE

Initiatives During Covid 19 – We worked on Covid awareness and relief In which this work was done by dividing it into many parts like – First - Awareness work was done at home and community level about not being the Covid, this has helped in stopping the spread of Covid. Second - Incentives for the test in case of Covid, keep the spirits up, do not let the positive people lose their courage, home level care, doctor contact, information about community isolation centers and government assistance etc. Third- Our women community leaders get success to reduce the families problem, which families unemployed due to Covid find micro self employment opportunities for micro income, efforts for employment planning, efforts to increase skills and help people who are stressed with ration card, old age pension, widow pension etc. has achieved success. Fourth - Our responsibility to mitigation of hunger problem. During first Covid lockdown, We distribute 500 food and health kit to community specialty widow and old age family through community leaders. Fifth - Awareness and promotion of Covid vaccination, An attempt has been made to clear the misconceptions spread in the village about this so that more and more people get the vaccine and keep themselves safe and prevent Covid. We were mobilizing the fund for this propose with different sources/stakeholders.



HOME BASED FISH CULTIVATION



Today the farmer family is not dependent only on agriculture, because the way the cost is increasing and the selling price is not getting, in such a situation, farming is proving to be a loss-making enterprise. In such a situation, along with farming, farmer families also look for other options and do other jobs including wages. Kanchan Seva Ashram along with some families in Mokama and Masaudhi block of Patna district, who have very little land, are trying to make fish farming popular and profitable, which does not take even time every day and thus the third income in the family. It is evolving as a means of Entrepreneurs were given training and exposure before starting the activity, this farmer is very happy with two crops and is getting profits.
